

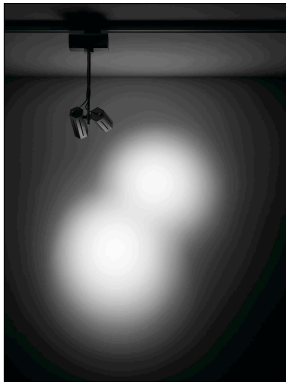
Fabbian lights 'Matisse. The seduction of Michelangelo'

The right balance between light and dark, which create unforgettable fascination and emotions, has been enhanced with the new museum projector Ombra, designed by Alberto Torsello, which Fabbian has developed just in order to illuminate high historical and artistic value works.

Ombra is a unique product that combines sophisticated design and technology. The main features of this projector are: LED light source with high performances and low consumption; perfect works' colors redemption by the light source LED CREE MC-E with 95 typical color rendering; maximum flexibility of the beam with three independent rotation axes; wide range of accessories to customize your lighting.

The Ombra LED technology has a further advantage: no emission of harmful UV and IR for the exhibits. The absence of these rays also gives the possibility to use lenses and synthetic materials with the result of a very precise guidance that would be impossible to obtain with traditional reflectors. The low consumptions reduce the production of CO2 and LED technology, thanks to the long duration of the light sources, cuts down the maintenance of the lamps.
